

## ***ABSTRACT***

The purpose of this study is to analyze in-depth the peace agreement through a notarial deed that has reached a peace agreement. It cannot be confirmed in a peace deed issued by the court through a decision and to analyze in-depth the understanding poured into a notarial peace deed that is not a settlement—binding and final. The theories used to support this research include the idea of the rule of law, the theory of legal certainty, the theory of justice, the theory of legal protection, the theory of notaries and the notary peace agreement. This study uses a normative juridical method and an empirical juridical approach. Normative juridical research is research that discusses doctrines or principles in legal science. The results of this study, among others, are the legal characteristics of a peace deed made before a notary in the formation of a law that is very important, considering that a notary has a vital role as a public official who is authorized to make an authentic deed. The decision issued related to the peace deed occurred in accordance with Article 1851 of the Civil Code which explains that peace is an agreement in which both parties, by surrendering, promising or withholding an item, end a case that is currently dependent or prevents an issue from arising. The conclusion of this research is that the arrangement of the Peace Deed made before a Notary is an authentic deed that has legal force as perfect evidence, regulated in the Civil Code Law and added to Law Number 30 of 2004 concerning the position of a notary as a deed maker. Law Number 2 of 2014 concerning changes in the role of a notary and the Supreme Court Regulation Number 2 of 2003 concerning mediation procedures in court.
